NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES & HANDICAP SYSTEMS

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Under RRS 87 Squib class rule C10.2(b) is in effect
- 1.3 A boats handicap will be adjusted, using RYA NHC, after every race. A system of progressive handicapping, where each boat's handicap is automatically adjusted on the basis of performance in each race, will apply to each subsequent race. The act of handicap adjustment or failure to adjust will not be grounds for a request for redress this changes RRS Rule 62.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The Regatta is open to boats of the Squib and Dragon classes whose owner(s) is/are a paid-up members of GHYC.
- 2.2 Helms must be paid up members of GHYC
- 2.3 Entries are only accepted on successful completion of the attached Entry Form, which must be delivered to the GHYC Club house with the Fees required for the Event
- 2.4 Please check the club web site for Online Payment options

3 FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:
 - 3.1.1 Squibs €20 & Dragons €25
 - 3.1.2 Payments should be made using the Online payment system EPP on the GHYC website and should be received no later than 23:59 on Friday 31st May

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: completed and signed Entry form should also be sent (preferably by email) to the Class Captain no later than 23:59 on Friday 31st May, or brought to the Registration.



4.2 Registration will take place in the GHYC Club house between 10:00 and 10:30 on Saturday 1st June

4.3.1.1 Squib FG will be 11:40

4.3.1.2 Dragon FG will be 11:50

4.3.2 Sunday 2nd June

4.3.2.1 Squib FG will be 11:40

4.3.2.2 Dragon FG will be 11:50

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 The SI's for the event include the GHYC Standard SI and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions (SSI) for this event will be available online before the event at <http://glandoreyc.com/racing/>

6 VENUE

6.1 The At Home Regatta will be sailed in the waters of Glandore Harbour to include areas extending to High Island

7 THE COURSES

7.1 The SI's will include details of courses to be sailed by all classes.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

8.1 For the Dragon & Squib classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by One-Turn Penalty, including tack & gybe, except when taking a penalty for infringing Rule 18 MARK - ROOM

9 SCORING

9.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTION

10.1 Keelboats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

11.1 A working VHF Radio is mandatory for all keel boats in all GHYC racing events.

11.2 The PRO shall broadcast on Channel 68 general information regarding racing to the fleet. Failure to broadcast this information, or to hear it, shall not be grounds for redress for any claim for redress.

12 PRIZES

12.1 Prizes will be awarded in all classes/divisions for daily results and overall series results.

12.2 The Regatta/Race Committee may operate a system which restricts the number of daily prizes awarded to any one competitor.

12.3 The Race Committee will award Prizes to both the following (Details will be included in the Supplementary SI's) :-



12.3.1 First Past the Post Entries

12.3.2 Those Entries using RYA NHC Handicap

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 13.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta

14 INSURANCE

- 14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid, third-party liability insurance including racing risk.

15 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

- 15.1 By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

16 ENVIRONMENT SUSTAINABILITY

- 16.1 As part of the venue's commitment to reducing the environmental impact of the event, we request that competitors, team leaders, coaches, volunteers, race officers and all stakeholders follow the Irish Sailing event sustainability guidelines. Details published here:
