
## NOTICE OF REGATTA

### 1 RULES & HANDICAP SYSTEMS

- 1.1 The Glandore Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Under RRS 87 Squib class rule C10.2(b) is in effect
- 1.3 International Dragon Class rule 13.30 (crew weight restriction) shall not apply, and rule 13.10 is modified to permit changes in the number of crew during an event or series.
- 1.4 Handicapping will be under the IRC or ECHO for cruisers and Portsmouth Yardstick for dayboats. Handicaps may be adjusted on a daily basis by the Race Committee as they deem necessary in the interests of all competitors.
- 1.5 The Dragon & Squib handicap will be adjusted, using RYA NHC, after every race. A system of progressive handicapping, where each boat's handicap is automatically adjusted on the basis of performance in each race, will apply to each subsequent race. The act of handicap adjustment or failure to adjust will not be grounds for a request for redress this changes RRS 62.

### 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The Regatta is open to boats of the Cruiser, Day Boat, Squib and Dragon classes whose owner is a paid-up member of GHYC.
- 2.2 Cruisers and Day Boats must supply with their Entry Form an evidenced Handicap rating of one of the following types: PY handicap, IRC or ECHO.
- 2.3 Helms must be paid up members of GHYC
- 2.4 Entries are only accepted on successful completion of the Members'Race Agreement or Entry Form, which must be emailed to the Class Captain by 23:59 the day before the first race or delivered at registration, and upon payment of the fees for the series at registration unless already paid on-line. Boats that have not entered as above will not be permitted to race.
- 2.5 Please check the club web site for Online Payment options
- 2.6 Late entries are accepted at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority.



### 3 FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:
- 3.1.1 Cruisers/Keelboats/Day Boats €25
- 3.1.2 Dragons €25
- 3.1.3 Squibs €20
- 3.2 Fees maybe paid either via EPP on the GHYC Web site or when completing Registration

### 4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: Registration will take place between 11:00 12:00 on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> August at the GHYC Club house, for information on completing the registration process see Entry Form
- 4.2 Racing Schedule
- 4.2.1 A Minimum of 3 boats in any fleet is required before a start will be scheduled.
- 4.2.2 One race per Fleet will be held on the day with First Gun times as follows:-
  - Cruisers/Keelboats/Day Boats First Gun will be at 13:00
  - Squibs First Gun will be at 13:15
  - Dragons First Gun will be at 13:20
  - Note Rolling start Squibs Start Signal will be the Dragons First Gu

### **5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

5.1 The GHYC Standard Sailing Instructions(SI's) and the Supplementary SI (SSI's) for the event will be available on line at http://glandoreyc.com/racing

### 6 VENUE

6.1 The Regatta/Race will be sailed in the waters of Glandore Harbour to include areas extending to High Island

### 7 THE COURSES


7.1 The Supplementary Sailing Instructions will include details of courses.

### **8 PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 8.1 The Scoring Penalty, RRS 44.3, will apply to the Keelboat/Cruiser/Day Boat classes. The penalty will be 20%, rounded up to next whole number, of the total entries for the boats class, added to the boats finishing score.
- 8.2 For the Dragon & Squib classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by One-Turn Penalty, including tack & gybe

### 9 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 9.1 A Working VHF Radio is mandatory for all boats in all GHYC racing events.
- 9.2 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.



9.3 The PRO may broadcast on Channel 68 general information regarding racing to the fleet. Failure to broadcast this information, or to hear it, shall not be grounds for redress for any claim for redress.

### **10 SAFETY REGULATIONS**

10.1 Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's)

All competitors shall wear PFDs at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet suits and dry suits are not PFDs. This alters RRS Rule 40

### 11 PRIZES

- 11.1 The Regatta/Race Committee will award Prizes as below Details will be included within the Supplementary SI's
- 11.1.1 First Past the Post Entries for each of the Dragon and Squib fleets
- 11.1.2 Dragons & Squibs using RYA NHC Handicap for each Fleet
- 11.1.3 The First Overall in Dragon and Squib fleets combined using RYA NHC ratings for each class.
- 11.1.4 The First overall in the Cruiser and Day Boat handicap fleets

### 12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

12.1 Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta

### 13 INSURANCE

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid, third-party liability insurance including racing risk.

### 14 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

14.1 By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

### 15 SCORING

15.1 One race is required to complete a series.

### 16 ENVIRONMENT SUSTAINABILITY


