SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

These Sailing Instructions must be read in conjunction with the NOR

1 SCHEDULE OF RACES

1.1 The Schedule will be as described in the NOR

2 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags : Squib – Code Flag Naval Numeral 9

Dragon – Code Flag D

Cruisers – will be announced on the day.

3 RACING AREA AND MARKS

3.1 The Racing Area is described in the NOR.

Three marks will be used: Harbour Mark (standard mark), High Island (standard mark), and a special mark called Siege Cove, which will be located approx. 150m south of the Siege Cove Rock which is half a mile east of Goat Head at the east entrance to Glandore Harbour.

The standard marks will be pencil buoys, and the description of Siege Cove will be announced on the day.

4 THE COURSE

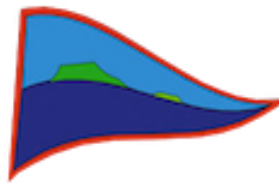
4.1 The course for the races is planned as follows: Start: 1st lap, 2nd lap, finish. (see lap details below). The Start line will be in the area between Harbour and Sunk Rock.

Course 1: Each lap (after starting): Siege Cove leave to starboard, High Island to starboard, Harbour to port, pass through the start/finish line.(approx. 9.5NM assuming a beat to High Island)

Course 2: Each lap (after starting): High Island to port, Siege Cove leave to port, Harbour to port, pass through the start/finish line.(approx. 9.5NM assuming a beat to Siege Cove)

Depending on wind conditions, the Race Officer may at his discretion modify the length of the course for each class, to be announced before the Warning Signal.

4.2 Courses may be shortened in accordance with RRS Rule 32.2(a). "Shortened Course" may be broadcast on ch. 68, at the discretion of the PRO. Flag "S" and the class flag will be displayed from a committee support boat close to a mark of the course and the finish will be between that mark and the "S" flag.



- 4.3 Courses may also be shortened by the Race Committee displaying Code Flag F in the vicinity of a mark while making repetitive sound signals. Boats should round/pass the mark on the required side and sail directly to the finishing line. Boats should cross the finish in the direction from the mark at which F is displayed. This adds to RRS Rule 32.2.

5 THE START

- 5.1 A staff with an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and a Red flagged limit mark. The location of the committee boat will be identified on the day via VHF channel 68.
- 5.2 The race committee signal boat may have a buoy/dinghy attached to the stern which shall be considered part of the mark
- 5.3 An inner Limit mark, red buoy with pole, may be positioned between the Outer Limit Mark and the Committee boat near to the Committee boat, and if so boats shall start between the Outer limit mark and the Inner Limit mark at the final crossing of the Start Line
- 5.4 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

6 THE FINISH

- 6.1 A staff with a blue flag on the Race Committee boat and a Red flagged limit mark unless the race is shortened in accordance with SI 4.2. The Race Committee Boat may display one or more class flags to indicate which classes are finishing.

7 TIME LIMITS

- 7.1 The Race Time Limit will be 4 hours

8 SCORING

- 8.1 As RRS Appendix A, First past the post finish for each class, and first on corrected time at the end of the first lap for all boats.

9 PRIZES

- 9.1 Prizes will be awarded after the completion of the race at a time and place to be advised.

10 SAFETY

- 10.1 Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's). All competitors shall wear PFDs at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet suits and dry suits are not PFDs. This alters RRS Rule 40

11 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 11.1 Protest forms are available from the race officer at the race office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 11.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 11.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.
