NOTICE OF REGATTA

1 RULES & HANDICAP SYSTEMS

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Irish Sailing Prescriptions. Also respective Class Rules will apply unless specifically advised otherwise.
- 1.2 The regatta will be conducted in accordance with the rules related to Covid-19 as specified from time to time by the Irish Sailing Assn and by GHYC.
- 1.3 Under RRS 87 Squib class rule C10.2(b) is in effect
- 1.4 Under RRS 87 Dragon Class Rule 13.30 is not in effect

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 This event is open to the following classes:-
 - 3.1.1 International Dragon
 - 3.1.2 National Squib
- 3.2 All boat owners and helms, except visitors to Glandore, must be paid up members of Glandore Harbour Yacht Club. Visitors shall be paid up members of their National respective fleet Associations.
- 3.3 Visitors will be granted temporary membership of Glandore Harbour Yacht Club for the duration of the event.
- 3.1 Eligible boats may enter the event by using the online Entry Form which can be found on the documents table for this event on the GHYC Web site. Entries are only accepted on successful completion of the Entry Form, and upon payment of the fees for the series at registration unless already paid on-line.
- 3.2 Late entries are accepted at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority.

4 FEES

- 4.1 For club members the fee for this race is included in the Annual Race Fee. For an visitors or club members who have not paid the Annual Race Fee the required fees are as follows:



- 4.1.1 Dragons €50
- 4.1.2 Squib €20
- 4.2 NOTE: The costs of Crane-in and Crane-out are not included in the entry fee. These will be €60 for each lift. These should preferably be paid in cash at the launch, but may be included when visitors are paying using MyEasyPay as described below, there are two fee options, Race entry only and Race Entry including crane fees. To help us with planning please let us know that you would wish to be craned in and/or out by no later than the 14th August.
- 4.3 Members fees should be paid via [Easy Payment Plus](#) (EPP) when completing the Entry Form.
- 4.4 Guests who do not have an account with EPP can pay using MyEasyPay using the following link: <https://pay.myeasypay.com/myeasypay1.aspx?id=1002> select the appropriate fee for Rose Bowl Regatta. This link can also be found on the Club's website homepage.

5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Crane in/Out is all from Union Hall Pier and will be as follows: -
 - 5.1.1 Crane In August 20th from 0900
 - 5.1.2 Crane Out August 21st from 1600
- 5.2 Registration: Saturday August 20th 10:00 – 11:00 at the GHYC Club House
- 5.3 Competitors Briefing Saturday August 20th 11:00 GHYC Club House
- 5.4 Racing Schedule
 - 5.4.1 Saturday August 20th
 - 5.4.1.1 First Gun Dragons 13:00
 - 5.4.1.2 First Gun Squibs 13:10
 - 5.4.1.3 Three races will be attempted for each fleet
 - 5.4.2 Sunday August 21st
 - 5.4.2.1 First Gun Dragons 12:00
 - 5.4.2.2 First Gun Squibs 12:10
 - 5.4.2.3 Two races will be attempted for each fleet
 - 5.4.2.4 No Warning Signal after 15:30

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1 The GHYC Sailing Instructions(SI's) for the event will be available on the club website prior to the event.

7 VENUE

- 7.1 The Regatta/Race will be sailed in the waters of Glandore Harbour to include Glandore Bay depending upon conditions.

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The Sailing Instructions will include details of courses to be sailed by all classes.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 9.1 For the Dragon & Squib classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by One-Turn Penalty, including tack & gybe

10 SCORING

- 10.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 All races count, no discard.



11 MOORING

- 11.1 Visitor berthing for this event will be advised prior to Crane In of visitor boats
- 11.2 Boats should aim to have their own means of getting between shore and boats in accordance with ISA Covid recommendations, however a water taxi may be available for the duration of the regatta/race before and after racing and to schedule at other times.. See SI Supplement for Event

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 12.1 A Working VHF Radio is mandatory for all keel boats in all GHYC racing events.
- 12.2 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 12.3 The PRO shall broadcast on Channel 68 general information regarding racing to the fleet. Failure to broadcast this information, or to hear it, shall not be grounds for redress. This alters RRS Rule 41.

13 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 13.1 Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's)
All competitors shall wear PFDs at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet suits and dry suits are not PFDs. This alters RRS Rule 40

14 PRIZES

- 14.1 The Regatta/Race Committee will award Prizes to include the Rose Bowl Trophy and other prizes.- Details will be included within the SI.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 15.1 Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta

16 INSURANCE

- 16.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid, third-party liability insurance including racing risk.

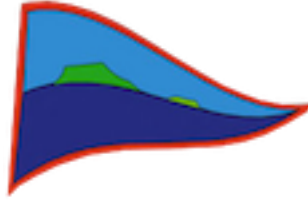
17 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

18 ENVIRONMENT SUSTAINABILITY
