NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES & HANDICAP SYSTEMS

- 1.1 The Event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). Also, respective Class Rules will apply unless specifically advised otherwise.
- 1.2 Under RRS 87 Squib class rule C10.2(b) is in effect
- 1.3 International Dragon Class rule 13.30 (crew weight restriction) shall not apply.
- 1.4 Handicapping will be under the IRC or ECHO for cruisers and Portsmouth Yardstick (PY) for dayboats.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The Race is open to boats of Squib and Dragon classes and cruisers, whose owner is a paid-up member of GHYC. Cruisers will be required to produce a verifiable handicap for their boat, which can be converted to PY.
- 2.2 Helms must be paid up members of GHYC
- 2.3 Three boats in a class are required to hold the race for that class.
- 2.4 Entries should be done by completing the online Entry Form which must be done by 11:00 the day of the race, unless the whole season fee has been paid. The Entry Form can be found on the Racing Information page on the club website, see:



3 FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:
- 3.1.1 Cruisers/Day Boats €25
- 3.1.2 Dragons (€30 unless the whole season fee has been paid.
- 3.1.3 Squibs (€20 unless the whole season fee has been paid.
- 3.2 Fees for club members should be paid online using the EPP system which may be accessed via the GHYC web Home Page.

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration must be done online using EPP.
- 4.2 Racing Schedule: there will be a single race for each fleet
- 4.2.1 One race per Fleet will be held on the day with First Gun times as follows:-



- Squibs First Gun will be at 12:00
- Dragons First Gun will be at 12:10
- Cruisers First Gun will be 12,20

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 The SI's for the event will be available online before the event at http://glandoreyc.com/racing-information/

6 VENUE

6.1 The Race will be sailed in the waters of Glandore Harbour and Bay to include areas extending to High Island and Siege Cove to the east, a half mile to the east of Goat Head.

7 THE COURSES

7.1 The Sailing Instructions will include details of courses. The intention is to have a long race based on the 1908 race course chart.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

8.1 For all classes, RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by One-Turn Penalty, including tack & gybe.

9 SCORING

- 9.1 One race is required to complete a series.
- 9.2 Dragons and Squibs will be scored without handicaps for fleet results.
- 9.3 If the same course is used for Dragons and Squibs a combined fleet handicap result using the PY for each class will be produced.

10 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 10.1 Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's)
- 10.2 All competitors shall wear PFDs at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet suits and dry suits are not PFDs. This alters RRS Rule 40

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 11.1 A Working VHF Radio is mandatory for all boats in all GHYC racing events.
- 11.2 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 11.3 The PRO may broadcast on Channel 68 general information regarding racing to the fleet. Failure to broadcast this information, or to hear it, shall not be grounds for redress for any claim for redress.

12 PRIZES

- 12.1 The Race Committee will award Prizes to the following as below Details will be included within the SI's
- 12.2 First Past the Post results 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for each class.



12.3 Handicap prize for the Dragon or Squib with the fasted PY corrected time (if the same course is sailed).

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

13.1 Competitors participate in the Race entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the race.

14 INSURANCE

14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid, third-party liability insurance including racing risk.

15 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

15.1 By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

16 ENVIRONMENT SUSTAINABILITY

16.1 As part of the venue's commitment to reducing the environmental impact of the event, we request that competitors, team leaders, coaches, volunteers, race officers and all stakeholders follow the Irish Sailing event sustainability guidelines.
