SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
Amended 29 August 2024

These Sailing Instructions must be read in conjunction with the NOR

1 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 1.1 Flag signals will not be flown ashore. Postponements or abandonments will be posted on the club noticeboard.

2 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 2.1 The Schedule of Races is detailed in NOR.
2.2 In the event that the weather prevents the planned number of races being held on the first day, the schedule for the second day may be altered. Check the GHYC website/Racing Information page for amendments to the NOR and also relevant WhatsApp groups.

3 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be: Squib – Code Flag Naval Numeral 9

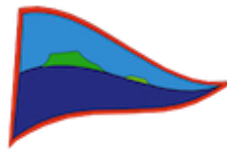
Dragon – Code Flag D

4 RACING AREA AND MARKS

- 4.1 The racing area will be in Glandore Bay depending on conditions
4.2 The marks shall be as the Map of Standard Marks Racing Page Documents and or laid marks described by the Race Officer.

5 THE COURSES

- 5.1 The courses for the races will be made up by the PRO and advised over the VHF 68.
5.2 Courses may be shortened in accordance with RRS Rule 32.2(a). "Shortened Course" may be broadcast on ch. 68, at the discretion of the PRO. Flag "S" and the class flag will be displayed from a committee support boat close to a mark of the course and the finish will be between that mark and the "S" flag.
5.3 Courses may also be shortened by the Race Committee displaying Code Flag F in the vicinity of a mark while making repetitive sound signals. Boats should round/pass the mark on the required side and sail



directly to the finishing line. Boats should cross the finish in the direction from the mark at which F is displayed. This adds to RRS Rule 32.2.

6 THE START

- 6.1 A staff with an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and a Red flagged limit mark. The location of the committee boat will be identified on the day via VHF channel 68.
- 6.2 The race committee signal boat may have a buoy/dinghy attached to the stern which shall be considered part of the mark
- 6.3 An inner Limit mark, red buoy with pole, may be positioned between the Outer Limit Mark and the Committee boat near to the Committee boat, and if so boats shall start between the Outer limit mark and the Inner Limit mark at the final crossing of the Start Line
- 6.4 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

7 THE FINISH

- 7.1 A staff with a blue flag on the Race Committee boat and a Red flagged limit mark unless the race is shortened in accordance with SSI 5.2. The Race Committee Boat may display a Blue flag with a class flag(s) to indicate which class(es) are finishing.
- 7.2 Boats that have finished shall not re-cross the finishing line in any direction except for some unavoidable cause. The Race Committee may lodge a protest. This changes RRS 60.
- 7.3 Boats that have finished shall not re-cross the finishing line in any direction except for some unavoidable cause. The Race Committee may lodge a protest that the boat had continued to sail the course and had not finished (see Definitions/Finish).

8 TIME LIMITS

- 8.1 The Race Time Limit will be 90 minutes
- 8.2 Finishing Window will be 15 minutes from the time the first boat has finished.
- 8.3 Any Boat failing to finish within the Finishing Window will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

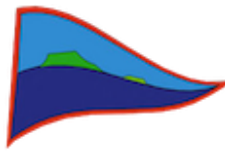
9 SCORING

- 9.1 The number of races that are required to be completed to constitute a series is defined in the NOR.
- 9.2 Discards will be deducted from the Boats total score as follows:-

Number of Races	Discards
4 or more	1

10 PRIZES

- 10.1 Rose Bowl Trophies/Prize will be awarded as follows:-
 - 10.1.1 Event Trophy/Prize (Each Class) – Glandore Inn Rose Bowl Trophies and additional prizes for First place boats. Additional prizes for Second and Third place boats.
 - 10.1.2 Prizes for the best GHYC boat in each class unless already a winner 1st, 2nd or 3rd in which case awarded to next best placed GHYC boat
- 10.2 Golden Sail Trophy – Dragons – winner of races sailed on Sunday 1st September
 - 10.2.1 Event Trophy/Prize – Perpetual Golden Sail Trophy and keeper prizes for First place boats. Keeper prizes for Second and Third place boats.



11 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 11.1 Protest forms are available from the race officer at the race office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 11.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 11.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.
- 11.4 Arbitration as described in RRS Appendix T will be offered.

12 SAFETY

- 12.1 Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's). All competitors shall wear PFDs at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet suits and dry suits are not PFDs. This alters RRS Rule 40
